    - (2) Middle School responses again echoed negative responses regarding bullying.
    - (3) High School questions mostly mimicked the middle school questions with again, 44% responding negatively about bullying.
  - Over all there were positive responses regarding school safety and how students liked their schools.
  - These results were district-wide. Hopefully next year, this information can be school specific.

- b) Plessy v. Ferguson 1896, John Marshall Harlan, Supreme Court
  - Separate but Equal.
  - Harlan Dissenters
- c) Brown v. Board of Education U.S. Supreme Court May 17, 1954
  - Separate but Equal "has no place in NC" Racial segregation outlawed.
- d) 1956 was an election year and voters in the south did not support Brown, while outside the South there was much support.
- e) The Declaration of Constitutional Principles (known informally as the Southern Manifesto) was a document written in February and March 1956, in the United States Congress, in opposition to racial integration of public places.
- f) Relevance of "1956" Things changed because of how we responded in 1956.
- g) The Patriots of North Carolina Opposition group
- h) September 8, 1956 Special Election
  - The Pearsall Plan to Save Our Schools, known as the Pearsall Plan, was North Carolina's 1956 attempt at a moderate approach to integrate public schools after racial segregation of schools was ruled unconstitutional by the <u>United States</u> <u>Supreme Court</u> ruling <u>Brown v. Board of Education</u> (1954).

### III) Parker Turpin - Finance

  - Renters must prove liability insurance @ \$1,000,000.
  - School functions should always take precedence over outside rentals.

(1) Purchase orders *must* be created and have prior approval *before* any purchases are made. If not, we are out of compliance.

## h) Contracts

- All signatures must be attached PRIOR to the contracted work beginning. This is an audit exception.
- Documentation is required to pay the contract. Just because a contract has been completed, does not mean that someone will be paid. Payroll needs verification that the work has been done is needed for payment.

### i) Kelly Vaughn - State Health Plan

- Open Enrollment this year is Sept 30 October 31, 2017.
- The Consumer Directed Plan is being eliminated.
- Reminder to employees to complete the Tobacco Attestation or there will a \$60/mth increase.
- There will be a rate increase for *each* plan this year.
- When enrolling online, employees should print out a verification of their enrollment as a backup in case of any question.

# j) Worker's Compensation

- On RCS site > Staff > Accident Employee Report
- Use this for an employee-related accident.
- The employee should file this online.
- An injured employee should *not* go to their personal doctor. The school system has Worker's Compensation physicians that the employee must see.

#### k) Public Records Request

- Most anything that happens in a school can be requested as public information such as salaries, expense reports, etc.
- A good rule of thumb is: if you would not want it see in a newspaper, then do not put in writing or in an email or it becomes public record.

# I) Staff Development Forms

- If you are requesting any kind of reimbursement, a Staff Development Form is required.
- If you will be away from your school for an entire day *or* a half day, you should complete a staff development form, *whether money is involved or not*.
- If consecutive days are involved, they may be reported on one form. If the days are not consecutive, complete separate forms. If consecutive dates crossover from one pay period to the next, then complete separate forms as well.
- Out of county travel must be submitted on an RCS Travel Reimbursement (long) form for reimbursement and have an approved Staff Development Form to accompany it.
